Connections

The second reading this Sunday is not easy to follow, especially when some of Paul's sentences are more like paragraphs. But you will notice that he makes several important connections: between sin and death, between Adam and Jesus, and between obedience and disobedience.

Sin, he says, is the cause of death. Of course, everyone is subject to death at some point, even if they haven't sinned. A less serious sin can be a little "death" when it makes us feel that we are not as close to God as we could be. And sins that we might think are not a big deal, like smoking, can lead to serious health problems.

The connection between Adam and Jesus is not so obvious. Adam was the first to bring sin and death into the world. Jesus is the first to bring forgiveness by his death on the cross. The main difference between them is that Adam disobeyed God, while Jesus was obedient to his Father. Adam reminds me of a child who knows what he is supposed to do, but thinks that he can do the opposite and get away with it.

In the Gospel, Satan can be thought of as trying to get Jesus to do things the easy way. When he tempts Jesus

to turn stones into bread, he shows Jesus an easy way to feed the people. But Jesus takes a better way, when he feeds us with himself in the Eucharist. The devil says Jesus can throw himself off the temple as a dramatic way to attract followers; Jesus lets himself hang from the cross to draw people to himself. Satan promises the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will only worship him. But Jesus chose to be crowned with thorns and receive his kingdom when he rose from the dead.

**Anointing of the Sick,
Sunday, March 22nd at 1:00 pm in the Church**

About the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick can be received by Catholics who are planning to have serious surgery, "in danger of death" or "advanced in years". "Advanced in years" is a judgment call. Examples of those "in danger of death" include those undergoing treatment for cancer and other life-threatening diseases. Also those going in for surgery in which the patient will be given full anesthesia and put to sleep, not just given a local anesthesia.

Before Vatican Council II, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was called Extreme Unction. People also called it "the Last Rites". Catholics waited to the last possible minute to call for the priest to come administer the sacrament.

Vatican Council II changed all of that. The Anointing of the Sick can be received more than once.

At Nativity, Father Kingsley offers the Anointing of the Sick periodically to all in a parish service. Father also offers this sacrament to the Catholic residents of the assisted living facilities and nursing homes on James Island.

Please do not wait until the last minute to request the Anointing of the Sick. There is a grave shortage of Catholic priests in this area. If a person waits until the last minute, a priest may not be available.

Father Kingsley requests that those who know they are going into the hospital for surgery make arrangements for him to anoint them before or after one of the weekday or weekend masses.

Once again, the **Nativity Ladies Guild**, will be collecting Grocery Gift Cards. These will be given to Neighborhood House who will use them to purchase Easter meals for our hungry neighbors. This is a great way to practice Lenten almsgiving.



Here is how this works:


- Visit a grocery store and purchase a gift card.
- Any amount is great.
- Walmart and Food Lion are preferred but all local food stores are acceptable.
- Write the value of the card on the front of the card.
- Put the envelope in the collection at Mass between now and April 5

LENT: THE TIME FOR PRAYER, FASTING AND ALMSGIVING

Lenten Penitential Requirements:



Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, not to equal one full meal. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year.

Abstinence (from meat) is observed on all the Fridays of Lent in addition to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It is obligatory for all who have reached their 14th year.

The Exceptions:

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence include the physically or mentally ill, individuals suffering from chronic illness such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.


Reconciliation Service


