

## Greater Than Jesus?

Of all the promises Jesus made to his disciples, I sometimes find the one at the end of today's Gospel to be the most amazing of all. Jesus tells his disciples that they would do greater works than he did. What could be greater than walking on water, curing a blind man, raising the dead, or feeding five thousand people with only a few loaves of bread?

First, we have to ask what Jesus would think is greater. The apostles performed many miracles because of their faith in the Lord. They cured the sick, and Peter even brought a dead woman back to life (Acts 9:40). Paul resuscitates a young man after practically boring him to death (Acts 20:7-12). But even these signs are not greater than what Jesus did.

No, Jesus meant greater in the sense of the true work of a disciple. When he sent the disciples out to cure the sick and cast out demons, his main purpose was to have them preach the Good News. Getting people to change their hearts and follow him was more important than impressing them with his miracles or amusing them with his parables. The disciples started right after Pentecost, when they received the power of the Holy Spirit. Peter went outside and began preaching to the people—not just any crowd, but those who called for Jesus to be crucified (Acts 2:14-41). The story ends with three thousand people getting baptized.

I wonder if we have the same kind of trust in Jesus that the apostles had. Would we be able to speak to a large crowd of non-believers and get them to all be baptized?

## THINGS TO KNOW

**Religious Education Programs:** Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8. PSR classes are held in the School Building from 10:00 to 11:15 am on Sunday mornings during the school year. To register, please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

**Creating Safe Environments:** All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade must also have participated in a 7<sup>th</sup> grade PSR or Catholic school program. Some members of Nativity Parish continue to receive **SCAM email and text messages**, ostensibly from Fr. Kingsley. (See example at left.)

- These emails are not from Fr. Kingsley (or any other member of the Nativity Staff.)
- Fr. Kingsley's email account has not been 'hacked'.
- There is no action we can take to prevent these types of scams.

You are receiving these messages from someone unknown to us who wants to steal from you. **So Beware!**

### May Crowning Modified for the Situation

One of the traditions at Nativity, both in the school and the Parish School of Religion (PSR) programs, is to celebrate a May Crowning Devotion where we read scriptures about Mary, sing Marian hymns and pray the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We crown Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth, and typically process and bring/offer her flowers as a sign of our love for her.

Since children are not physically in school at this time, we will offer the opportunity for devotion to Mary on Mother's Day weekend. The statue of our Blessed Mother will be set up in the church during regular prayer hours on Saturday, May 9 (12 noon to 5 pm) and Sunday, May 10 (9 am to 12 pm), with vases all around. We invite you to drop by the church for prayer and to bring a flower from your yard, if you like, to place in one of the vases.

### Mother's Day Blessing at Nativity

This Sunday (May 10th) is Mother's Day, we invite families to bring mom by for a special Mother's Day blessing. Weather allowing, Father will be set up outside the church from 9:00 am to 11:00 am to offer this blessing to moms.

### Our Lady of Fatima Feast is May 13



Mary has appeared many times in recent history. One of the most powerful of Mary's apparitions in modern times was to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal in May of 1917. The three children were Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta Marta. They saw the figure of a lady brighter than the sun, standing on a cloud in an evergreen tree. The Lady appeared to these children six times between May and October of 1917. Each took place on the 13<sup>th</sup> of the month, except in August, when the date was the 19<sup>th</sup>.

On October 13<sup>th</sup>, when Lucia asked the Lady who she was and what she wanted, she replied with these words: "I am Our Lady of the Rosary; I wish to have a chapel in my honor on this spot. Continue to recite the Rosary every day. People must mend their ways, ask pardon for their sins, and no longer offend our Lord, who is already too much offended."

**Her message at Fatima was to accept life's sufferings and continue to pray for all people throughout the world.**



**Regularly Scheduled Masses resume in Diocese of Charleston churches on May 11.**



May 2, 2020

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As society moves forward with the reopening of public spaces, we must ensure that the Diocese of Charleston does all that it can to provide for your spiritual needs and welcome you home. Our primary goal is to approach the lifted restrictions with great care, keeping the safety of all our parishioners and our clergy at the forefront of our decision-making.

On Thursday, after conferring with the College of Consultors (the priests who advise me on many important matters), I decided to resume the sacraments with in-person daily Mass beginning on Monday, May 11. Our first Vigil/Sunday Masses will be held the weekend of May 16.

We want to have the freedom to participate in Mass together in a peaceful manner, but also in good health, so your pastor/administrator will spend the next several days developing a plan on how your parish will operate in the current climate and under the restrictions we have set forth. These restrictions have been developed based on recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, plus mandates from state government and recommendations from those dioceses that have already resumed Masses. Your pastor/administrator will communicate the specifics of his plan for your parish no later than May 10.

Although we will do all we can to provide a safe environment, the risk of contracting COVID-19 will still exist. Therefore, I am still granting dispensation to those who are uncomfortable attending weekend Mass and those who are high risk until further notice.

We are all hungry to receive the sacraments once again. This time away from the Eucharist has been painful. And, for so many, that struggle has been compounded by the loss of income and freedom for our families. These new guidelines may be challenging, so I ask everyone to do their very best to adjust to the new normal together as one family in faith.

May God continue to bless each of you in this season of the Resurrected Lord.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I'm happy to share with you some good news. Beginning Monday, May 11, Bishop Guglielmone will allow limited celebrations of public Masses. The limitations are designed to protect your health. The main limitation will be the number of people who can attend each Mass. Our church has a seating capacity of 734. The Bishop has limited us to 25% of seating capacity. However, out of an abundance of caution, we will limit the number of people at each weekday Mass to 50, and the number at each weekend Mass to 125. That will allow plenty of room for social-distancing.

The Bishop's dispensation from attending Sunday Mass remains in effect during this transition period. Those with underlying health conditions and the elderly should consider not coming to Mass.

**The sick and vulnerable should definitely not come to Mass.** If you would feel more comfortable with a smaller number of people, then you may wish to attend a weekday Mass instead and use that as your "Communion day". Below is our **interim Mass schedule:**

Day	Time	Maximum number
Monday	11:30 pm	50
Tuesday	11:30 pm	50
Wednesday	11:30 pm	50
Thursday	11:30 am	50
Friday	11:30 am	50
Saturday	5:30 pm	125
Sunday	9 am and 11:30 am	125 at each Mass

Once we reach our maximum number, then no one else can come to that Mass. We will send you a link so you can reserve places for you and your family at the weekend Masses. If we see the need, we will add additional weekend Masses. Those who are not signed up will only be allowed if spaces remain. If you cannot access the signup list via "SignUpGenius", please call the church office and leave a message with Mass time and number of attendees. We will register you and only call you back if spaces are full for requested Mass time.

If you would like to schedule a Mass intention, then please put your Mass intention envelope in the basket at the back of the church, or through the mail slot in the parish office door, or email me at [Pastor@NativityCharleston.org](mailto:Pastor@NativityCharleston.org). The parish office will be manned at irregular times during this transition period so the staff can work from home as much as possible.

#### Other Safety Guidelines at Mass

- ⇒ You may wish to wear a protective mask.
- ⇒ Please use the restroom only when absolutely necessary.
- ⇒ Stay at least six feet away from non-family members at all times.
- ⇒ Please don't use the hymnals. We will provide disposable worship aids.
- ⇒ There will be no sign of peace.
- ⇒ Communion will only be distributed in the hand.
- ⇒ There will be no social events, such as coffee and doughnuts, before or after Mass.
- ⇒ We will ensure proper cleaning of frequently touched surfaces after each Mass.
- ⇒ There will be no Children's Liturgy, Nursery or Quiet Room available during this time.
- ⇒ Please take crying children outside if needed.

#### Other Sacraments

- ⇒ RCIA members will be welcomed into full communion with the Church on May 30, the vigil of Pentecost, at the 5:30 pm Mass.
- ⇒ Weddings and funerals may be celebrated with the limitations stated above.
- ⇒ We will inform you of the dates for First Communion and Confirmation once they are determined.
- ⇒ Confessions on Saturdays from 4:15 – 5 pm are tentatively scheduled to resume on June 6.
- ⇒ For Baptisms, contact Mary Smith at [DRE@NativityCharleston.org](mailto:DRE@NativityCharleston.org).

#### Offertory

I want to sincerely thank all of you who have continued to generously support our parish during this quarantine period. You have used electronic giving, mailing in your collection envelopes, or else putting your envelopes through the mail slot in the office door.
