

## You Are What You Eat

In John's Gospel, Jesus gives a long discourse on the Bread of Life. The first part talks of bread as a sign of God's loving care for the people. Like the manna in the desert, Jesus represents God caring for the people in a new way. But the part we hear in today's Gospel is more specific. He says the bread he will give is his flesh. The leaders of the Jews don't understand. Hopefully, we can do better.

In the pagan world at the time of Christ and before, a sacrifice was also a meal. An animal was ritually killed and burnt (i.e., cooked) to be shared at a meal with the people. The sacrifice was a gift to the god(s) that joined the people to their deity and also to each other. So Jesus used that understanding of sacrifice to explain his gift of self. He would die on the cross as a sacrifice to the Father and we would share in the meal by consuming bread and wine, which are his Body and Blood. That meal is shared today in the Eucharist.

Better than the pagan sacrifice, the Eucharist unites us with God because Jesus is both human and divine. His humanity allowed him to represent us to the Father, as a lawyer represents a client to the court. Jesus' divinity allowed his sacrifice to be worthy of the Father, as no merely human gift could be. So giving his life on the cross was the best and only way that he could offer a true sacrifice to the Father.

The Eucharist also unites us to one another. We share this meal with other Christians as a sign of our common

## Mass and Sacrament Guidelines for the Current Conditions

### Social distancing remains in effect for Mass. Here are the guidelines at Nativity

As stated by Bishop Gugliemone, Mass attendance must not exceed 50% of our sanctuary's seating capacity of 734. However, to allow plenty of room for social distancing at Nativity

- The number of people attending each weekend Mass is limited to 150.
- Once we reach our maximum number, then no one else can attend to that Mass.

### The Bishop has extended the dispensation from the requirement to attend Sunday Mass during this transition period.

- Those with underlying health conditions and the elderly should consider not coming to Mass.
- The sick and vulnerable should definitely not come to Mass.
- If you would feel more comfortable with a smaller number of people, then you may wish to attend a weekday Mass instead and use that as your "Communion day".

### The Interim Mass schedule at Nativity

- Monday through Friday—Mass is 11:30 am
- Saturday—Mass is 5:30 pm and attendance is limited to 150
- Sunday—Masses are 9:00 and 11:30 am and attendance is limited to 150 at each Mass.

- If you cannot access the online sign up system, please call the parish office and leave a message with Mass time and number of attendees. We will register you and only call you back if spaces are full for requested Mass time.
- Once we reach our maximum number, then no one else can register for that Mass.



- **Starting Monday, June 15, sign up is not required for weekday Mass.**

### To schedule a Mass intention,

- Put your Mass intention envelope in the basket at the back of the church,
- or put it through the mail slot in the parish office door,
- or email your intention to Fr. Kingsley at [Pastor@NativityCharleston.org](mailto:Pastor@NativityCharleston.org).

### Other Safety Guidelines at Mass

- You may wish to wear a protective mask.
- Please use the restroom only when absolutely necessary.
- Stay at least six feet away from non-family members at all times.
- Please don't use the hymnals. We will provide disposable worship aids.
- There will be no sign of peace.
- Communion will only be distributed in the hand.
- There will be no social events, such as coffee and doughnuts, before or after Mass.
- We will ensure proper cleaning of frequently touched surfaces after each Mass.
- Children's Liturgy, Nursery and Quiet Room are not available during this time.
- Please take uncomfortable children outside if needed.

### **Saturday afternoon confessions (4:15 to 5:00 pm) resumed June 6**

- Please examine your conscience and know your sins before you go to confession. During these extraordinary times, there will only be a few minutes to have your confession heard. So please be brief.
- Wear a mask if you wish.
- Ensure there is six feet of separation between you, other people waiting in line, and the priest.
- If you choose to go behind the screen, the priest will sit six feet away from the screen.
- Disinfecting wipes will be available in the confessional. When exiting, please wipe any surface you may have touched, such as the kneeler, a chair, and the door knob.
- It is recommended that you wash your hands after going to confession.

### **Anointing of the Sick**

- Currently, priests are not being allowed to visit hospitals, nursing homes and assisted living facilities.
- If you are having a procedure and want to be anointed beforehand, please contact Fr. Kingsley to schedule a time to be anointed at the church office.

### **Other Sacraments**

- Weddings and funerals may be celebrated with the limitations stated above.
- We will inform you of the dates for First Communion and Confirmation once they are determined.


You will be our doctors, our engineers, our laborers and leaders. The future is in your hands, and I know you will do good in this world.


