

## Two Steps Forward

Why did Jesus walk on water to the disciples in the boat? Did he want to scare them? No, his first words to them were "Do not be afraid." While they were being tossed by wind and waves, he showed them that he was not affected by the storm. If they had had faith, they might have realized that if Jesus was safe, they would be, too. We too must make that leap of faith, especially when we are afraid.

Peter seemed to be willing to take the leap as he stepped into the water. But when his attention was distracted by the strong winds, he began to falter. This is where we can apply the story to ourselves.

Our growth in faith is not a steady progression. For every two steps forward, we may take one step back. For example, we receive God's forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation and rejoice in God's loving mercy, but later we fall back into sin. We ask God's help in prayer and when our prayer is answered, our faith in God grows. Then we become ill or wreck the car, and think that God has abandoned us. But isn't that a natural reaction?

It is natural to doubt God in times of trouble, but we are choosing to live in the supernatural when we become followers of Christ. Like Peter, we need to keep our attention on the Lord. As long as Peter looked to Jesus, he could walk on water. Only when he focused on the wind did he lose his nerve and begin to sink.

In a similar way, we can lose our focus on the Lord. We see someone we love who is gravely sick. We make a serious mistake that gets us in trouble.

**Creating Safe Environments:** All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade must also have participated in a 7<sup>th</sup> grade PSR or Catholic school program. This program is permitted up to 5,000 students statewide for a total of \$32 million in aid.




## RCIA Teams Up with Symbolon The RCIA process (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)



## Feast of Mary's Assumption Saturday, August 15

The church has always held to the belief that Mary was assumed, body and soul, into a heavenly state, even though the belief was not declared as dogmatic until 1950. The early church had a robust tradition of revering relics from the saints of the day. The complete lack of relics from the Mother of Jesus was seen as evidence of this Marian belief. The celebration of the event as a feast dates back to the fourth century in the East and the seventh century in the West.

Since Mary was untouched by the stain of sin, she was unable to experience the "wages of sin," which is death. But her Assumption also says something about humanity as well. Sin only has power over us if we allow it. Mary was freed from this power in her Immaculate Conception, and when she responded "yes" to God. We were freed from that power when Jesus died and rose, conquering death. Now, we must

respond "yes" to claim the victory that was already won for us. On this feast, we should not only celebrate the great works God has done for us through Our Lady, but also celebrate the truth that we have the opportunity to one day spend eternity with her and her Son, Jesus.



## Good News!

After over 10 months of meeting with City of Charleston officials, and jumping through their hoops for storm water approval, we finally have our Building Permit. Now we can start building our Parish Life Center. Our contractor is Charles Blanchard Construction Corporation. They are currently putting together their construction schedule for our Life Center. We will keep you informed of our progress.

### What needs will the Parish Life Center fill?

- The need to build community in a gathering place that encourages people to meet, plan, and feel at home in their own space.
- Current facilities only available to parish activities when not being used by the school, after-school program, or athletic practices.
- School classroom meeting spaces not conducive to adults, i.e. student sized desks.
- The school library does not hold more than 20 adults comfortably.
- The need for available meeting space during the time school is in session.
- No technology readily available in the school hall; AV equipment must be brought in.
- Use of the Parish office conflicts with regular office staff functions.
- Current parish office not handicap accessible.

### How will we use Parish Life Center?

- A more appropriate space for small and medium size gatherings.
- A space that could be constructed with updated technology options.
- A gathering place for the family of the deceased prior to a funeral.
- An appropriate place for the Children's Liturgy Program during Mass.
- Gatherings for parish young adults, high school and youth activities.
- A meeting place for senior activities during the day.
- A bride's room for preparations before a wedding.
- Adult Faith Formation activities.
- A space that could house a small lending/resource library for faith formation for all parishioners.
- Pancake breakfasts and coffee and doughnuts after Mass.
- Storage which is badly needed.
- A meeting space for parish groups and Bible studies.
- RCIA Activities.
- Catechist training.


