

## Clear Conscience

Usually, the first reading has something in common with the gospel. Today's however, has more in common with the second reading from St. Peter. They both talk about Noah and the ark, where the few good people were saved by going through the water. Peter compares that to the waters of Baptism, in which we are saved by God. Just as God washed away the evil of the world in the waters of the flood, so the waters of Baptism made us into a new people who have clear consciences, both because God has forgiven our sins and because we promise to follow only Him.

That leads to the Gospel, where Jesus is tempted by Satan. But unlike the people of Noah's time, Jesus does not fall to the temptations. Instead, he comes out of the desert, telling us to repent and believe in the good news.

That means we have a choice to make: Do we accept this kingdom and repent, or do we ignore our baptism and do what we want? Do we still have a clear conscience when we think of how much time we spend getting to know Jesus? Ever pray or read the bible outside of church? Do we spend near as much on the poor, as we do for our entertainment?

Next time you see a rainbow, think about the covenant that God made with Noah. Just as God's promises get better and better till the coming of Jesus, we are challenged to be more and more like Him. Are you satisfied with just a promise that God won't destroy us all in a flood? Or are you ready to live the New Covenant that Jesus promises to those who will follow him?



# LENT: THE TIME FOR PRAYER, FASTING AND ALMSGIVING



For centuries, Roman Catholic believers have celebrated the Stations of the Cross, or Way of the Cross, during Lent.

The Stations of the Cross began as the practice of pious pilgrims to Jerusalem who would retrace the final journey of Jesus Christ to Calvary. These pilgrims walked the path of Christ from Pontius Pilate's praetorium to Christ's tomb. They stopped at each of the historic sites and prayed.


Few could actually visit the Holy Land and walk in the footsteps of Christ. So the practice has been to "bring the holy sites to the people."

As objects, the stations may be made of sculpted or carved stone, wood, or metal, or they may be paintings or engravings. Usually, these are arranged around a church or cathedral, but sometimes they're arranged along roads leading to a church or shrine.

Though the stations of the cross and the number of stations has varied throughout history and have varied between Catholic and Protestant practice, the typical version consists of 14 stations. These are: 1-Christ is condemned to death / 2-Jesus carries His cross / 3-Jesus falls / 4-Christ meets His mother / 5-Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry His cross / 6-Veronica wipes the face of Jesus / 7-Jesus falls a second time / 8-Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem / 9-Jesus falls a third time / 10-Jesus is stripped of His garments / 11-Jesus is nailed to the cross / 12-Jesus dies on the cross / 13-The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross / 14-Jesus is laid in the tomb.

**Most simply, the stations of the cross are about remembering Christ's suffering for our sake.**

## Lenten Penitential Requirements:



**Fasting** allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, not to equal one full meal. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year.

**Abstinence** (from meat) is observed on all the Fridays of Lent in addition to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It is obligatory for all who have reached their 14th year.

### The Exceptions:

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence include the physically or mentally ill, individuals suffering from chronic illness such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

**All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.**




