

Who Needs Love?

Part of the first reading from Acts that we don't hear is a vision Peter has, in which God tells him that all foods are OK to eat; no longer are some unclean. He later realizes that the vision was a symbol that all people are "clean," Gentiles as well as Jews. Not all of the early Christians understood. The Jewish Christians were shocked that the Holy Spirit would give gifts, such as speaking in tongues, to Gentiles. Especially Gentiles who had not been baptized.

Now the distinction between Gentile and Jewish Christians doesn't seem very important today. But we still need to follow St. Peter's example of sharing our faith in Jesus. Does that mean we should drag any non-believers we meet to church on Sunday? Should we brag about how much we love God?

Today's gospel gives us a hint at what we can do to bring others to Christ. Jesus makes it sound simple: Love one another as I love you. (Jn 15:12) The second reading from John tells us that love is not people loving God; it's that God loved us first, enough to send his Son to die for us. We may think that we have chosen to love and follow Jesus, but as the gospel tells us, Jesus chose us before we ever chose him. So maybe that part about loving others as Jesus loves us is this: are we willing to love others without requiring that they love us first?

How can we do that? I can introduce myself to someone new to the parish that I see in church. I can offer to help the poor without waiting for the pastor to beg. I can make a priority of seeing what I can do for others, instead of what they can do for me. Perhaps part of our daily prayer can be asking God to show us who needs our love today.

Religious Education Programs Online: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8th. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8th, enrolled in non-parochial schools. PSR had ended for the year but we are accepting registration for the next school year. Please register by contacting Mary Smith at 843-795-3821

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. 
The Leper Priest of Moloka'i

Lived (1840-1889) Feast is May 10

Some saints transcend religious and ethnic boundaries to touch the heart that beats in each human being: Damien was a most extraordinarily compassionate man.

Far from his native Flanders' (Belgium) idyllic beauty and rich culture, Damien volunteered to bear Christ's love to Moloka'i's bleak leper colony. There he built decent homes, opened schools, established clinics and planted farms. He also shared the sufferings and the social stigma of those with whom he delighted to identify: "We lepers," he would proudly say when he finally contracted the disease.

Since the 1800's, medical science has developed cures for leprosy. Moreover, many of us are not called to a life of ministry on an island in the middle of the Pacific Ocean. However, we are all called to examine our compassion and imitate Damien's radical love for our neighbors in our own island community.

The Creed at Mass

Following the readings and the homily, we stand together and say the Creed. This is our profession of faith. The Creed is a solemn statement of belief, a “rule of faith”. It states the core of what we believe about God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The language of the Creed is difficult at times. Its purpose is to express, with precision, what we believe about God.

The Creed that we pray most often, the Nicene Creed, came out of the earliest ecumenical councils: Nicea in 325 and Constantinople in 381. It originated at a time of great controversy about the divinity of Christ. The longest section of the Creed describes that Christ is truly human and truly God.

The place of the Creed, after the readings at Mass, is significant. We listen to the word of God, we profess our faith in God, and then we come to the altar to worship our God.

We say the Creed regularly at Mass. It can become so familiar that we may say the words without really thinking about what they mean. Try to focus and pray the prayer; for this is what We Believe. ..Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co

Our Lady of Fatima Feast is May 13

Mary has appeared many times in recent history. One of the most powerful of Mary's apparitions in modern times was to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal in May of 1917. The three children were Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta Marta. They saw the figure of a lady brighter than the sun, standing on a cloud in an evergreen tree. The Lady appeared to these children

six times between May and October of 1917. Each took place on the 13th of the month, except in August, when the date was the 19th.

On October 13th, when Lucia asked the Lady who she was and what she wanted, she replied with these words: "I am Our Lady of the Rosary; I wish to have a chapel in my honor on this spot. Continue to recite the Rosary every day. People must mend their ways, ask pardon for their sins, and no longer offend our Lord, who is already too much offended."

Mary's message at Fatima was to accept life's sufferings and continue to pray for all people throughout the world.




