

Don't Look Back

It's bad enough that the Israelites were grumbling against their leaders. But they also complain to God that they were better off as slaves in Egypt. After all God did to bring them to freedom, now they want to go back to slavery. Before we judge them too harshly, we might ask ourselves if we ever act like that. For us, it might be looking back on our slavery to sin.

We would never sin if there wasn't something attractive about it. We might confess the sin and say we'll never do that again, but we often can't resist the memory of our past sins. As we hold on to the past, the temptations come back and draw us to repeat our offenses. Even though we know we are better off putting it behind us, we sometimes find it difficult to move on. Notice that the Israelites look back to their time in Egypt, while the people of Jesus' time look back to the manna in the desert, yet none of them ever had manna!

So how do we free ourselves from the past? Should we look to the future, instead? If we want to make the world, or just our community, a better place, we can make plans. If those plans are ever going to work, we have to begin now. Jesus doesn't tell us to dwell in the past or dream of the future. No, he keeps us focused on the present moment, telling us to believe in Him now, His Father gives us true bread and Jesus is that bread of life.

Those words are just as true today. We may look fondly at the past, but if we don't let Jesus be born again in us, and if we don't take up our crosses each day--we are missing the chance to experience Jesus in us and in the people we live and work with each day.

THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery: Is offered to children age 6 weeks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9:00 am Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. **Planning to re-open in September—Volunteers are Needed.**

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Is currently unavailable at the 9:00 am Mass as we assess space and volunteer needs in hopes of re-starting this ministry sometime in the Fall of 2021.

Religious Education Programs: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8, enrolled in non-parochial schools. PSR has ended for the year but we are accepting registration for the next school year. Please register by contacting Mary Smith at 843-795-3821

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. To complete this program, please visit <http://charleston.CMGconnect.org>. For more information please contact Vicki Vázquez at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. Alpha: is a series of sessions that explore the Christian faith. These sessions provide an opportunity to explore life's big questions, to say what you think and to hear other people's points of view. Care of the Sick and Homebound: We care about you. To arrange for a pastoral visit, please contact the parish office at 843-795-3821.

Sacrament of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are suffering from a potentially life-threatening illness, those planning to have serious surgery and those in advanced years. 



St. John Vianney—The Curé d'Ars—Feast is Tues. Aug. 4th

John Vianney was born on May 8, 1786, in the French town of Dardilly. The Vianneys were devout Catholics who helped the poor and gave hospitality to strangers. John was not considered to be bright and had a poor education. However, John wanted to become a priest and eventually his superiors came to realize that his hard work and piety compensated for his limitations. John was ordained to the priesthood on August 12, 1815.

Sometime after his ordination, John was assigned as priest to the town of Ars (population 230). In making this assignment, his bishop probably expected that John could 'do little harm' in a town like Ars. John's superiors had no idea of the tremendous good that God would accomplish through this humble priest.

At Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent about the faith and quite comfortable with their life style. He fasted much and slept little. John Vianney came to realize that the devastation wrought on the Catholic Church by the French Revolution, had resulted in religious ignorance and indifference. At the time, rural folks spent Sundays working in the fields, or reveling in the taverns. Vianney gave many homilies against such behavior. However, it was John's insight as a confessor that was his most remarkable gift. During the winter he frequently spent 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. During the summer this time was increased to 16 hours. Such was the demand and fervor for reconciliation. As a result of his personal prayer and holiness, John could read the souls of people and lead them to Christ.

John Vianney died on August 4, 1859 at the age of 73. The bishop presided over his funeral with 300 priests. More than 6,000 people were in attendance. The number of attendees is a strong testimonial to the profound effect that John Vianney had on people's lives and souls. John Vianney was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925 and is the patron saint of priests.


