

Chicken or Egg

The second reading of Paul to the Ephesians talks about forgiving one another. It reminds me of the line in the Lord's Prayer, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." (Mt 6:12) You could read that line as a warning that God only forgives those who forgive others. Paul reverses that conditional meaning to say that we forgive because God has already forgiven us. So which came first, the chicken or the egg?

In a sense, both are needed: Jesus died on the cross to show that God forgives sins you haven't even committed yet. But God does not force his forgiveness on us. It is a gift, given freely. We have to want to be forgiven and accept that gift from God. And we also have to be willing to forgive those who have hurt us. There are many ways to do that.

One is to forgive in your heart. If it is someone you love, you know they didn't mean to hurt you and so you don't get angry at them. If you don't love the one who hurt you, you still need to forgive, so you can let go of the hurt. (And be forgiven for not loving your neighbor!)

Paul also tells us to let go of bitterness, anger, and shouting. Instead of getting even, we are told to be kind and compassionate (Eph 4:32.). We can go to the next step after forgiving in our hearts: We show our forgiveness in our actions. A friend or relative might get a hug; others might get a handshake or words of forgiveness.

Jesus showed how much God wants to forgive us by his death on the cross. Because we are forgiven, we are then able to forgive others. So while God's love and forgiveness are always first, we must be able to forgive others so that we can accept it from God.

Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. 



St. Maximilian Kolbe—Volunteered to Die in the Place of Another Man. Feast is August 14

Maximilian Kolbe was born on January 8, 1894, in a section of Poland that was under enemy control of the Russians. His parents were industrious workers who faced many hardships. Many of Maximilian's siblings died and his father was hanged for working for independence.

His life was strongly influenced by a vision he had of the Virgin Mary when he was 12. At age 13, Maximilian left home and enrolled in a Franciscan seminary in Hungary. By 1919 he had been ordained a Franciscan priest and had earned Ph D degrees in Philosophy and Theology.

Kolbe was strongly motivated to 'fight for Mary' against enemies of the church. He helped the Franciscan Friars publish pamphlets, books and a daily newspaper. Their monthly magazine grew to have a circulation of over 1 million and was influential among Polish Catholics. Kolbe acquired a radio license and publicly broadcast his views on religion. He was successful in

using the latest technology to spread the Catholic message.

At the start of the Second World War, Kolbe was residing in a monastery in Poland. In 1939, when Poland was overrun by the Nazis, he was arrested but was released after three months. Many Polish refugees and Jews sought sanctuary in Kolbe's monastery. Kolbe helped to hide, feed and clothe 3,000 Polish refugees and his newspaper strongly criticized the Nazis.

Fr. Maximilian Kolbe was imprisoned at Auschwitz in 1941. Toward the end of his second month in Auschwitz, men were chosen to face death by starvation as warning to the prisoners against attempting escapes. Kolbe was not chosen but volunteered to take the place of a man with a family. Despite forced starvation, Fr. Kolbe continued to minister to the prisoners that were with him. He was the last of the group to remain alive. On August 14, 1941, his captors ended his life with a fatal injection because they wanted to use his cell for another purpose.

Pope John Paul II canonized Fr. Maximilian Kolbe as a "martyr of charity" in 1982.


