Give Them Some Food Yourselves

The Gospel for this feast reminds me of what my aunt used to tell us when we would visit her and share a meal. Her favorite saying was, "If you don't get enough to eat, it's your own fault." Perhaps Jesus would say the same as he feeds us with his Body and Blood.

Some say that the multiplication of loaves was not done by breaking the laws of physics. Instead, they say that Jesus, when he began to share the little bread that he had, touched the hearts of all those who had brought food with them. They followed his example by sharing their food also—so much that there were twelve baskets left over.

Jesus came to change people's hearts, to show them God's love and how to love one another. The miracle of changing bread and wine into his Body and Blood is not just so we can feel good about having Jesus so near to us. It is meant to strengthen us to do our best as his disciples. As food and drink help us to keep on working, his Body and Blood help us to keep on loving.

When the disciples told Jesus about the hungry crowd, he told them, "Give them some food yourselves" (Luke 9:13). And one day they would. When they celebrated the Eucharist after Jesus' resurrection, they gave that spiritual food to the new followers of Christ. We continue that today. With Jesus' strength we can teach all people about the Father's love for them and how they can love each other.

THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery: Is offered to children age 6 weeks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9:00 am Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. **The Nursery is temporarily closed while the school is under construction.**

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Is offered to children age 4 years through 5th grade during the 9:00 am Mass on Sundays. The children are dismissed after the opening prayers and re-join their family for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. **This ministry is currently unavailable as we assess space and volunteer needs.**

Religious Education Programs: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8, enrolled in non-parochial schools. For more information, please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. To complete this program, please visit <http://charleston.CMGconnect.org>. For more information please contact Vicki Vázquez at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. Alpha: is a series of sessions that explore the Christian faith. 



Feast is June 21 A Saint for Today's Youth

In some ways, Louis (English translation of Aloysius) had it all. He was born in 1568, the son of a rich and powerful Italian nobleman. As first born son, he stood to inherit his father's title and all the family's wealth (Ah, life is good!).

Louis grew up amid the violence and brutality of Renaissance Italy. Two of his brothers were murdered. Furthermore, he and his parents didn't always agree on things (sound familiar?).

When he was 8 years old, he got sick with a kidney disease. While he was ill, he took the opportunity to read about the saints and spent much of his time in prayer (Facebook and Twitter had not yet been invented). After reading a book about missionaries in India, Louis felt strongly that he wanted to become a missionary himself. He started practicing by teaching catechism classes to the poor children. Louis continued to suffer from poor health for the rest of his life but he was known for his dedication to prayer and fasting.

In 1585, Louis began his studies in Rome to become a Jesuit priest. In 1591, the plague broke out and Louis volunteered to care for the sick. The Jesuits opened a hospital for the stricken. Aloysius carried the dying from the streets into a hospital where he cared for the sick. He washed and fed the plague victims and prepared them to receive the sacraments.


In March 1591 he contracted the plague at age 23 and died on June 21 1591. Aloysius was canonized a saint in 1726 and in 1926, Pope Pius XI named Aloysius Gonzaga patron of all Christian youth..

This is a 10 session study presented by Dr. Michael Barber.



U.S. Bishops launch 3-year Eucharistic Revival

The intent is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

The revival officially started on the feast of Corpus Christi (June 16, 2022), with a diocesan focus that will include eucharistic processions and other events of adoration and prayer around the country. The revival will continue for three years; until the 2024 National Eucharistic Congress which starts on July 17, 2024.

Bishop Jacques Fabre-Jeune, CS, has requested that parishes conduct Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration each Thursday, specifically for the intention of vocations.

Nativity will have an Hour of Adoration at noon every Thursday beginning on July 7.

Other Revival events will be conducted regularly throughout the Diocese of Charleston.

All members of the Nativity Community are encouraged to participate in the Eucharistic Revival.

Juneteenth National Independence Day is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved black Americans.

On January 1, 1863, during the American Civil War, President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation. This executive order declared more than three million enslaved people in Confederate States to be free.

More than 2 years would pass before the news reached the enslaved Americans living in Texas. It was not until union soldiers arrived in Galveston on June 19, 1865 that the state's residents learned that slavery had been abolished. The former enslaved people immediately began to celebrate with prayers, feasting, song and dance.

"Juneteenth" was declared a national holiday in 2021.

We pray through Christ our Lord. Amen.


