As a boy my favorite board game was "Chutes and Ladders". The players roll dice to move from the start to the finish, from the bottom of the board to the top. If you land on a chute, you slide back and down. It was a bummer. Land on a ladder, you jump well up the board and near the goal. It was a thrill to find a ladder and draw closer to the goal. That's life, isn't it? At every moment, we're either moving closer or farther from the goal of our lives.

How do we win? Jesus tells us the secret of life's chutes and ladders hinges on getting our loves rightly ordered. What we love in life is meant to be a ladder, drawing us up into God's love — including our family, friends, work, play, food, and drink. Even to give your water to someone out of love for Christ leads to a sure reward.

But those ladders of our loves can become chutes. If we love even our family members more than Christ, we slide down and back. If we love the persons and things in our life for the sake of Christ, He says we "surely will not lose our reward." The key difference between a chute and ladder, between our spiritual regression and advancement, is our willingness to renounce everything - even our own life - for the love of Jesus. THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery: Is offered to children age 6 weeks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9:00 am Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. The Nursery is temporarily closed while the school is under construction.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Is offered to children age 4 years through 5th grade during the 9:00 am Mass on Sundays. The children are dismissed after the opening prayers and re-join their family for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. **This ministry is currently unavailable as we assess space and volunteer needs.**

Religious Education Programs: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8, enrolled in non-parochial schools. For more information. please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. 

Catholic Radio in SC on WLTQ 730 AM and 106.7 FM


These stations broadcast Catholic Radio content twenty four hours a day. In addition to radio show offerings from the



Saint Maria Goretti, An Exemplar of Heroic Virtue—Feast is July 6

Maria Goretti was born in October 1890 in Italy. She was the third of seven children of a poor peasant family. In order to make ends meet, Maria's father, Luigi entered into partnership with a man named Serenelli, The Goretti family also shared a residence with Serenelli and his two sons, one of whom was named Alessandro.

Maria's father died of malaria in 1900 but the family continued to live with the Serenelli family. Maria was

naturally pious, kind, and helpful. She took over household duties while her mother, brothers, and sister worked in the fields.

He often made advances against Maria and threatened to kill her if she told her mother. Maria resisted his repeated harassment and narrowly managed to escape. However, one day, Alessandro arranged things so that he would be alone in the house with Maria and he assaulted her. Maria fought him off and told him she would rather die than allow him to do what he wanted to do to her. He became enraged and stabbed her—many times.

Maria was taken to the hospital where she died a day later on July 6, 1902. But before her death she specifically forgave her attacker. She was 11 years old.

Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII on April 27, 1947 and was canonized by him in 1950. Her mother, Assunta Goretti, was present, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization. Also present were other members of the Goretti family and possibly her now converted attacker, Alessandro Serenelli.

Maria's chastity was not just bodily purity, but an even greater virtue. She so loved her enemies that she wished them to be with her in heaven. She wanted Alessandro to become holy. These virtues are what make this eleven year old girl remarkable.
