THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery: Is offered to children age 6 weeks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9:00 am Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. **The Nursery is temporarily closed while the school is under construction.**

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Is offered to children age 4 years through 5th grade during the 9:00 am Mass on Sundays. The children are dismissed after the opening prayers and re-join their family for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This ministry is currently unavailable as we assess space and volunteer needs.

Religious Education Programs: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8, enrolled in non-parochial schools. For more information. please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. Care of the Sick and Homebound: We care about you. To arrange for a pastoral visit, please contact the parish office at 843-795-3821.

Sacrament of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those suffering from a potentially life-threatening illness, those planning to have serious surgery and those in advanced years. 

St. Kateri Tekakwitha the "Lily of the Mohawk"

Feast is July 14



Kateri was an indigenous American girl born in April, 1656 in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon (now upper state New York). The life of indigenous children was never easy due to the general harshness of life compounded by the frequent skirmishes with neighboring clans.

However, conditions were worst than normal in mid 17th century New York. The French and the Dutch colonists and their armies

were battling to gain control of land and business interests. Both groups coerced the indigenous people to 'take their side' via mis-representation, threats, violence and broken treaties.

So the world in which Kateri grew up was a very hostile and dangerous place. Kateri's clan frequently needed to migrate for their safety and survival. Note that this scenario is not unique to 17th century New York; it is repeated over and over, throughout the world to this day.


The colonists brought with them foreign diseases. Kateri was orphaned when she was 4 years old. Her parents, her brother and over half of her village died during a small pox epidemic. She contracted the disease, which left her severely scarred and nearly blind for the rest of her life. Her Mohawk name, Tekakwitha, means "she who bumps into things". Despite her special needs, she learned weaving, beading, cooking, and attending the sick in order to contribute to the life of her community.

Despite the hardships and tragedy of her life, Kateri was a devout child. As a teenager, she came under the tutelage of Catholic missionaries who were embedded in the colonists' armies. She embraced Christianity and made a vow of virginity. But, her commitment to Christianity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers.

She eventually migrated to a mission in southern Canada, where she became Catholic. She attended daily Mass, taught children, and ministered to the sick and the elderly. She died of natural causes in 1680 at age 24.

Within four years, pilgrimages to the site of her tomb had begun and healing miracles were attributed to her. Kateri was beatified by Pope Saint John Paul II on June 22, 1980, and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012. St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first indigenous American woman to be canonized.

Like St. Kateri, God invites us all to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.

Our first session ended on June, 28.


The discussion was inspiring and the dinner was totally fabulous. We are looking to build on this success with this new session.
