

Teaching With Authority

This dramatic healing of the demoniac in the Capernaum synagogue is the first action that Mark narrates after the calling of the first disciples. Precisely what connection does Mark want us to make between teaching and deliverance from demonic power?

One thing is crystal clear. What Jesus has to communicate is not simply a new idea, an alternative lifestyle that might catch the fancy of a few people. It is nothing less that the announcement of the coming of God in power to rescue God's people (that is what "Gospel of God" means in the language of Isaiah) and a demonstration of that announcement.

To say that the "kingdom of God" is at hand is to draw upon the apocalyptic world view and to say that God is about to manifest divine kingship by rescuing God's people from whatever oppresses them. The dramatic healing of the demoniac by an authoritative word is a demonstration of God's reign in their midst. And the people recognize it as such. This rescue from evil power is indeed new teaching, sustained by an authority that enacts what it claims: God's kingly power is at hand to

If we find ourselves depressed and oppressed by the evil we detect in others, perhaps we best hear the authoritative teaching of Jesus as a call to our own further conversion.

THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery: Is offered to children age 6 weeks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9:00 am Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. **The Nursery is temporarily closed while the school is under construction.**

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Is offered to children age 4 years through 5th grade during the 9:00 am Mass on Sundays. The children are dismissed after the opening prayers and re-join their family for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This ministry is currently unavailable as we assess space and volunteer needs.

Religious Education Programs: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8, enrolled in non-parochial schools. For more information. please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. Meet Sumy and Hermes Florez

After near 25 years of service in South Florida, Sumy and Hermes Florez, both Catholic public health physicians, relocated to Charleston. They joined the Church of the Nativity in May, 2020 during the pandemic.

In Charleston, Hermes started his journey serving as Department Chair of Public Health Sciences at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC). He also serves as an Endocrinologist at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC) in Charleston.

Hermes joined the Diocese of Charleston Deaconate Formation Program, Class of 2025. He was admitted to Candidacy in the Permanent Deaconate Program by Bishop Robert Guglielmone (September, 2021) and has since been installed into the Ministries of Reader (October, 2022) and Acolyte (October, 2023) by Bishop Jacques Fabre-Jeune. Hermes just completed the Master in Theology course work at St Leo University, and started the final year of his deaconate training.

Sumy is a Eucharistic minister on the team that regularly visits Roper Hospital and serves at the Barrier Island Free Medical Clinic on Johns Island.

One of the passages that Sumy and Hermes have embraced in their years of service in Charleston is from the Gospel of Matthew (9:37-38): "the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few". Both feel blessed to part of the Nativity Family!



According to tradition, Blaise was of noble birth, became a physician, was educated in the Catholic faith and eventually became bishop of Sebastia, a city in Turkey. Blaise was martyred in 316 AD for the crime of being a Christian. The feast of Saint Blaise is observed on February 3.

We know more about the devotion to Saint Blaise than we know about the saint himself. He was known to be a very holy priest. Legend has it that a mother came to Blaise with her young son, who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Through Blaise's prayers, the child was able to cough up the bone. Thereafter, St. Blaise became the patron for the cure of throat illnesses. Many Catholics have long sought the annual Saint Blaise blessing of their throats.

Nativity Belltower and Digital Carillon System

Many of you may have heard the digitally created bell sound Christmas songs first played through Nativity's new electronic carillon system before and after the Christmas Masses this past December.

Beginning the weekend of Jan 20/21, we began playing the "call to worship" before all Masses as well as the Angelus daily.

Our carillon system gives us the ability to play the peal for weddings, toll for funerals, and an extensive library of Catholic music for various occasions and liturgical seasons.

We are also in the process of acquiring a steel-framed belltower, with a 400lb striker bell, currently being cast and tuned in the Netherlands by the Royal EIJSBOUTS Bell Foundry. We hope to receive the bell and have the tower installed in the center courtyard between the Church and Parish Life Center by the summer of 2024.

The purchase of the bell, tower, and carillon are made possible through the generosity of Phyllis Cafiero and family.

It is their desire that the ringing of the bell and carillon will draw hearts and minds to God so that all may joyfully worship Him.




