

I am the true Vine

When Jesus calls himself the true vine he makes clear that no one can grow in spiritual fruitfulness and moral goodness unless they are rooted in God and in his life-giving word. Religious affiliation or association with spiritually minded people is not sufficient. Jesus Christ is the true source of life. He sustains us and makes us fruitful in living the abundant life which God has for us.

Vines characteristically have two kinds of branches, those which bear fruit and those which don't. The vine dresser must carefully prune the vine before it can bear good fruit. The non-bearing branches must be carefully pruned back in order for the vine to conserve its strength for bearing good fruit. Jesus used this image to describe the kind of life he produces in those who are united with him.

There is a simple truth here: we are either fruit-bearing or non-fruit-bearing. There is no in-between. But the bearing of healthy fruit requires drastic pruning. The Lord promises that we will bear much fruit if we abide in him and allow him to purify us. Trust in the Lord's healing and transforming power to give abundant life and fruit of his heavenly kingdom.

THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery: Is offered to children age 6 weeks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9:00 am Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. **The Nursery is temporarily closed until site renovations are completed.**

Religious Education Programs: Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children, grades K4 through 8, enrolled in non-parochial schools. For more information. please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Creating Safe Environments: All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete the Safe-Haven Online Abuse Prevention Training program. Baptism: To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. For more information please contact Mary Smith at 843-795-3821 x 104.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation: A two year preparation period is required for these sacraments. Children planning to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, must also have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program. Children planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade must also have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. Alpha: is a place to connect with other people who are open to exploring life, faith, and meaning. 





The National Day of Prayer shares common roots with the celebration of Thanksgiving; both were national proclamations establishing a day of prayer.

In the New England Colonies under British rule, traditional observances in late fall called for prayer and thanksgiving. The fall observance was established by President Abraham Lincoln as the official Thanksgiving holiday in 1863.

Observances in the spring or summer called for prayer and fasting. The spring observance was established by President Harry S. Truman in 1952 as the National Day of Prayer.

A great way to honor this day of observance is to attend Nativity weekday Mass at 11:30 am on May 2, and remain for the weekly hour of Eucharistic Adoration.


So What is a May Crowning?
