




#### The Leper Priest of Moloka'l Lived (1840-1889) Feast is May 10

Some saints transcend religious and ethnic boundaries to touch the heart that beats in each human being: Damien was a most extraordinarily compassionate man.

Far from his native Flanders' (Belgium) idyllic beauty and rich culture, Damien volunteered to bear Christ's light to Moloka'i's bleak leper colony. There he built decent homes, opened schools, established clinics and planted farms. He also shared the sufferings and the social stigma of those with whom he delighted to identify: "We lepers," he would proudly say when he finally contracted the disease.

Since the 1800's, medical science has developed cures for leprosy. Moreover, many of us are not called to a life of ministry on an island in the middle of the Pacific Ocean. However, we are all called to examine our compassion and imitate Damien's radical love for our neighbors in our own island community.
