

Only Jesus can free us from sin and guilt.

Which is more important to God - clean hands or a clean mind and heart? The Scribes and Pharisees were upset with Jesus because he allowed his disciples to break with their ritual traditions by eating with unclean hands. They sent a delegation all the way from Jerusalem to Galilee to bring their accusation in a face-to-face confrontation with Jesus.

Jesus explains that they void God's command because they allow their hearts and minds to be clouded by their own notions of what is true religion. Jesus accuses them specifically of two things. First of hypocrisy. Like actors, who put on a show, they appear to obey God's word in their external practices while they inwardly harbor evil desires and intentions. Secondly, he accuses them of abandoning God's word by substituting their own arguments and ingenious interpretations for what God requires.

Jesus points his listeners to the source of true defilement - evil desires which come from inside a person's innermost being. Sin does not happen. It first springs from the innermost recesses of our thoughts and intentions.

God in his mercy sent his Son Jesus Christ to free us from our sinful cravings and the burden of guilt, and to restore us to wholeness of life and goodness. But to receive his mercy and healing, we must admit our faults and ask for his forgiveness.

THINGS TO KNOW

Nursery

For children ages 6 wks to 4 yrs. old during the Sunday 9 AM Mass. It is located on the right side of the school's breezeway entrance. *Temporarily closed due to site renovations.*

Religious Education Programs

Nativity School serves students in grades K4 through 8. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is offered for other parish children (K4-Gr 8), enrolled in non-parochial schools. For information, please contact the Director of Religious Education.

Safe Environments Training for Volunteers

All volunteers who minister in programs involving children at Nativity Parish or School are required to complete prevention education and a background check. To initiate the process and volunteer, please contact the Parish Office Administrator.

Baptism

To schedule a Baptism preparation class, a parent should be an active parishioner. Godparents for Baptism must be active parishioners of Nativity or another Catholic parish. For information, please contact the Director of Religious Education.

Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation

These sacraments require a 2-year preparation period. To receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in the 2nd grade, children must have participated in a 1st grade PSR or Catholic school program; to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade children must have participated in a 7th grade PSR or Catholic school program. For information, please contact the Director of Religious Education.

Sacrament of Marriage

Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the proposed marriage date. For inquiry, contact the Parish Office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

This pastoral ministry provides compassionate presence, prayer, and sacraments to parishioners confined to their home, hospital, or nursing home. It includes Extraordinary Ministers to the Sick and Eucharistic Ministers who bring Holy Communion. To arrange a pastoral visit, please contact the Parish Office.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This sacrament is received by those suffering from a potentially life-threatening illness, those planning to have serious surgery, and those in advanced years. Please do not wait until the 'last minute' to request the sacrament; contact the Parish Office.

"Alpha" is a time to connect in a small group with others who are open to exploring life, faith, and meaning. Weekly sessions include sharing a meal, a brief video on an element of the Christian faith, and an opportunity for sharing individual thoughts and questions. 


Will meet On Sat. Sep 7 and 21 9:00 AM to Noon in the Parish Life Center.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Your Finance Council is pleased to provide this annual report for the fiscal year spanning July 2023 - June 2024. Throughout the year we have worked closely with Father Kingsley and the staff to develop the annual parish budget, review financial statements, monitor both offertory giving and parish expenses. Additionally, the council has provided oversight and guidance for construction-related projects.

Perhaps the most visible and noteworthy project completed this year was the addition of the Church Bell Tower and Bell. Other improvements included the installation of new entrance doors to the Church, repainting of parking lot spaces, and some needed tree removal. A significant ongoing project involves the repair and replacement of various components in our Church lighting system, with Mike Riley leading the due diligence process.

This year, the Council was pleased to assist in re-opening the nursery, and in the hiring process for our Church Secretary, Catherine Bowen as well as, Robbie Weaver, our new maintenance person. We were also able to coordinate with the Diocese to move funds from the Diocesan Development Funds to our Church Savings Account to better serve the needs of the parish. Throughout the year we have monitored trends in parishioner contributions. We continue to see increases in online giving through myEoffering with favorable feedback on the system's user friendliness. We encourage those who have not yet participated to consider using this convenient option. We are deeply grateful for your continued generosity and willingness to share your time, talents and treasure with the Parish. Thanks to your consistent support, we remain debt-free and in a healthy financial position. It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your Parish Finance Council for this past year.
